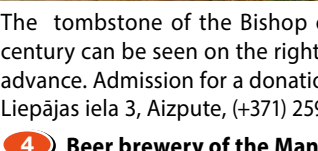
## 1 Livonian Order Castle Ruins

The Livonian Order built the fortifications in the 13<sup>th</sup> century. In the 15<sup>th</sup> century, a residential house was built at its eastern wall, with cellars and a gallery; thus the fortifications were turned into a castle.



## 3 Church hill and Aizpute St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church

Until the 13<sup>th</sup> century, the church hill was a hillfort for the Curonians, the ancient tribe in Latvia, and the Beida castle of the ancient Curonians was located on it. When German crusaders invaded the hillfort, St. John's church was built in the place of the castle in the 13<sup>th</sup> century, and it is currently one of the oldest buildings in Courland (Latvian: Kurzeme). Approximately 40 years after the building of the church – in 1295, when Bishop Burkhard governed – Aizpute became the capital of the Courland Bishopric and its monastery hosted the Domkapitel. The church holds an organ made by the well-known German producer Sauer in 1904.

## 4 Beer brewery of the Manor

The building was constructed in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century by uniting two older household buildings of the castle. In the past, the building had also had a wool spinning area next to the beer brewery but, during Soviet times, it was used for the production of lemonade. A tractor machinery station was situated here in the late 1950s. Liepājas iela 12, Aizpute



## 5 Stone Bridge

The stone bridge is the oldest and the most massive bridge in Aizpute town and it links the banks of the river Tebra. The bridge was built in 1907. Kazdanga Baron, Karl Wilhelm von Manteuffel, funded the construction of the stone railing so the central part of the railing has Manteuffel's coat of arms and the inscription of the year of construction. 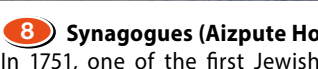


The solid masonry building with a tiled roof and built on stilts was built in the late 18<sup>th</sup> or early 19<sup>th</sup> century. The construction has a number of historic architectural details. In 1923, a metal turbine was installed in the mill instead of the previous wooden mill wheels. The mill produced a variety of flour, semolina, groats and pearl barley. In the mid- 1960s the mill stopped working because collective farms made their own mills. A private entrepreneur established a small power plant in the watermill in 1998. Liepājas iela 10, Aizpute

## 7 Aizpute historical town

Aizpute is one of the oldest towns in Latvia. It is situated on the right bank of the river Tebra. The first records of the town buildings can be found from the 14<sup>th</sup> century. The oldest part of the town was located in the territory surrounded by Atmodas, Jāņa, and Katolu streets, but later it was expanded towards Jelgavas, Kalvenes, and Kuldigas streets.



Aizpute is one of the oldest towns in Latvia. It is situated on the right bank of the river Tebra. The first records of the town buildings can be found from the 14<sup>th</sup> century. 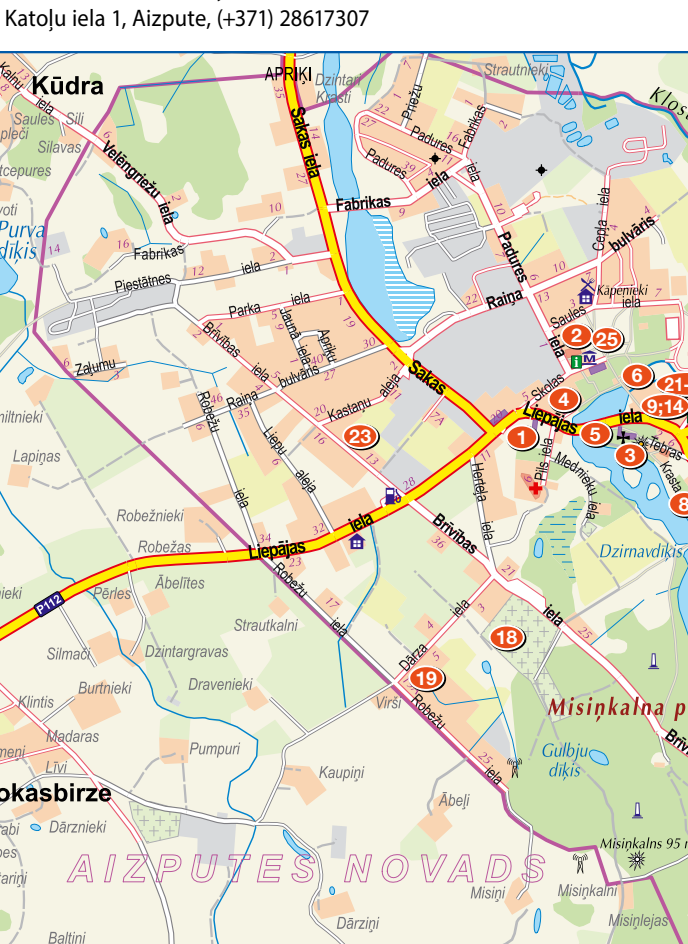


In 1751, one of the first Jewish communities in Courland (Latvian: Kurzeme) was founded in Aizpute. In 1881, more than a third of the population was Jewish. Aizpute Synagogue is the oldest of the currently existing synagogues there and was built in 1751. The Small Synagogue was built next to it in 1875. In 1941, all Jews dwelling in Aizpute were gathered together in the synagogue and brought to Kalvene in trucks where they were killed. After World War II, both buildings were joined together and used as the House of Culture from 1955. Atmodas iela 16, Aizpute



## 9 Valda Jēriņa Dolls room

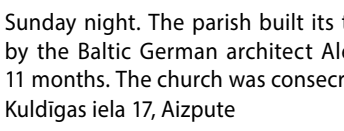
The exposition shows a collection of dolls created by national theatre actress Valda Jēriņa. There are more than 500 thematically dressed dolls in the collection: dolls in national costumes, school uniforms, theatrical and fantasy costumes. ## 10 Baptist Church

The first church was built in 1884; however 8 years later – in 1892 – the Tsar's administration gave an order to demolish the church under the pretence that the Baptist church was too closely related to the Orthodox church. In 1893, the church parish decided to purchase a plot of land at 17 Kuldigas street, for 750 roubles. The second church was built in the same year. The parish gathered in this building until 21 March 1937 when the building was destroyed by fire on Palm Sunday night. The parish built its third church according to a design by the Baltic German architect Alexander Schmeling, in a period of 11 months. The church was consecrated at Christmas in 1939. ## 11 Catholic Church

On 15 November 2002, the foundation stone of the church was consecrated and a special capsule was installed in it, containing evidence of the consecration of the foundation stone, a medallion of St. Benedict and the rosary. On 18 April 2009, the new Aizpute church was consecrated. Kuldigas iela 3, Aizpute



The Aizpute Pentecostal congregation was registered in 1989. In the same year, the parish purchased a building at 12 Kalvenes street and rebuilt it into a church. Kalvenes iela 12, Aizpute



The Adventist church acquired their meeting house in 1993. Before that, the church building hosted Aizpute Orthodox church parish. Kalvenes iela 38a, Aizpute



## 14 Weavers' Studio "Kamolītis"

The workshop offers its visitors to see the process of different canvas being woven in the looms according to ancient methods and using traditional ornaments. Katolu iela 1, Aizpute, (+371) 22847115

## 15 Lindenberg Cardboard Factory Building

This red brick three-storied house is a typical example of late 19<sup>th</sup> century manufacturing building with extensively decorated architectural design of the main facade. It was a local architectural monument during the Soviet era, and it still remains one today. The factory was opened in 1890 for the production of pharmacy boxes, small bags and labels. The factory's products were distributed across all the territory of Tsarist Russia until World War I. During World War II, the factory was used by the German army to fix-arms. Since 1960, the building has hosted the joint-stock company "Kurzemes Atslēga – 1" which produces ironmongery, door locks, and other goods. The decor of the club rooms of "Kurzemes Atslēga" is also spectacular and worth seeing. Kalvenes iela 27, Aizpute, (+371) 63448075, www.kat.lv



## 16 Jewish Cemetery

The cemetery was founded in the late 18<sup>th</sup> century, and it still has the largest part of the gravestones. Some of them are truly unique: they are made of cast iron and have Hebrew letter-shaped inscriptions in German.

## 17 Memorial plate of Latvian singer Mārtiņš Freimanis' childhood house

In 2014 at the International Cast Iron Art Symposium, the sculptor Kārlis Alainis created and cast a memorial plate for the famous late Latvian musician. Kalvenes iela 30, Aizpute

## 18 Memorial site for Latvian singer Mārtiņš Freimanis

The musician, poet and actor Mārtiņš Freimanis (1977–2011) was born and raised in Aizpute where he also attended Aizpute secondary school. M. Freimanis was buried in Misiņkalns cemetery in Aizpute. The sculptor Uldis Zariņš is the author of the memorial stone. Brīvības iela, Aizpute

## 19 Māris Linde decorative garden

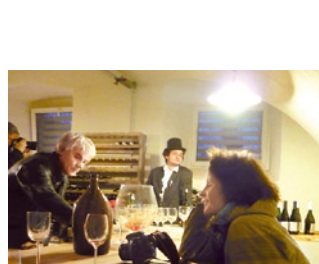
## 22 Art Gallery "Mētras māja"

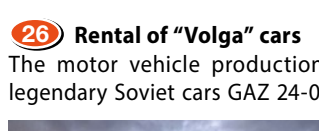
## 23 Workshop of painter J. Kalnmalis

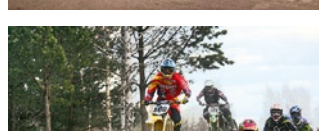
## 24 Ģirts Brumsons Art Park

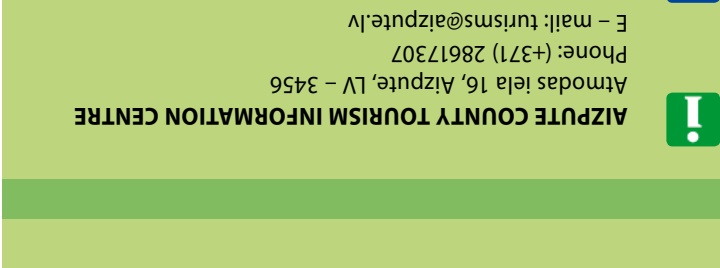

# SIGHTSEEING IN AIZPUTE COUNTY

## KAZDANGA

### 1 Kazdanga Castle and Manor

Kazdanga castle and manor was owned by the powerful Courland (Latvian: Kurzeme) barons von Manteuffels. Kazdanga castle was built by the famous Western European architect J. G. Berlitz in the early 19th century in the classicist style. Currently, the castle houses a museum where visitors can explore the history of Kazdanga village and see an exposition of "Bojas" Forestry Museum.

### 2 Cavalier House and Granary

Kazdanga castle was built simultaneously with two granaries on its sides where one was later turned into a cavaliers' house. This building preserves the peculiar baroque circular stairs that lead up to the attic. The interior is decorated by a genre mural "Kazdanga 1888. To the market." painted by two Latvian artists L. Gintere and F. Kirke in 1976 in the tempera technique. Classicism style parquet is preserved on the first floor of the building.

### 3 Crypt of Barons Manteuffels

The crypt was first created in the period from 1903 to 1904, but the work was halted by World War I. The crypt had a marble monument, fountains, and graves were covered with heavy stone slabs with the life details of the deceased. Today, 12 stone memorial plates remain here, and there is an indication of the place intended to store zinc coffins.

### 4 Stone Bridge

The stone bridge, which was built, in 1840 leads to Kazdanga castle at the end of an alley of linden trees and crosses a ravine. The bridge is popularly called the bridge of sighs (Latvian: Vaidu tilts). Why sighs? It is because a lot of tears, sweat and blood were shed when the bridge was built. The top of the bridge has small granite columns with iron chains and ornaments. Currently visible chains are said to have been used on ships. A fragment of a chain from the barons' period is on display in the museum.

### 5 Former manor pub building

The pub building was erected in 1868. The pub owner and his family lived in the northern end of the building. The middle section was used as a pub but the southern end was used for accommodating travellers and their horses overnight. During the period of Baron Karl Wilhelm, the pub was converted into a tea room. This building is a national monument of culture, and its main attractions and values are the facade, the old semi-circular arched windows and doors, as well as two iron wind indicators made in 1667.

### 6 Former manor horse stable (Kazdanga House of Culture)

Initially, the building was made as a house for servants in 1686. In 1914, it was converted into a horse stable, and then (1957-1959) the stable was rebuilt to use it as a house of culture. The interior decoration was created by the Latvian artist Albins Dzenis and wood sculptor Ernests Treimanis by applying the national style. Currently, the building hosts a cultural centre and a library. Pils gatve 4, Kazdanga, (+371) 26681805, (+371) 63497017

### 7 Mill and mill lake

The mill was built in 1840. Later, it was fully rebuilt, and only the facade gives a small glimpse into its past. Visitors can rent water bikes for recreation in the lake. Liepu gatve 10, Kazdanga, (+371) 28616717, (+371) 29103813

### 8 Cave

Kazdanga park with an area of 196 ha is a network of trails and bike paths. One of the biking trails winds along Dzirnezers lake and ends at the cave. Visitors can admire the beautiful scenery and attractive wooden sculptures. The cave built of field stone in 1914 was a favourite leisure and resting place of the Baron. ### 9 Kazdanga Milk Factory "Elpa"

The limited liability company Elpa is the only milk processing factory in southern Courland (Latvian: Kurzeme). The company was founded on 1993, and its name originates from the first letters of Latvian words which stand for: organic farming and recycling association. The company offers excursions around the dairy plant as well as tasting organic dairy products. It can accommodate groups of up to 20 people. Booking in advance is required. ### 10 Valāta Castle Hill

Valāta castle hill is situated 3 km from the centre of Kazdanga, between Vecpils and Valāta. It is one of the largest castle hills in the ancient Curonia state (Latvian: Kurša). The castle hill is naturally protected on three sides with two ramparts and two ditches on the northern side. The ancient town of several hectares was situated behind them. The castle hill is one of the most beautiful in the whole of Courland (Latvian: Kurzeme). It is believed that Laža castle, which was mentioned in the ancient Rhyme Chronicle and was destroyed by fire by Germans in 1263, was situated on the hill.



**11 Boja Manor**  
Boja manor was built in 1860 by Baron von Behr. Boja manor house is represented by a Latvian villa-type building. The designer of the manor focused on its spatial solution. There is a park with two ponds and plantations of European fir trees next to the manor. The manor building currently houses the Southern Courland Forestry of "Latvia's State Forests".

**12 Rokaži Manor**  
Built as a manor house, it now hosts "Rokaži" retirement home, which opened in 1946.

**13 Monument of Juris Zinbergs**  
The monument to the teacher and one of the main organisers of the unrest in 1905 – the revolutionary Juris Zinbergs – was unveiled in 1926, at the place of his death, on one side of the road to Rokaži Manor.

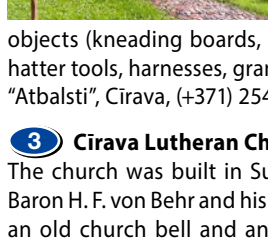
**14 Fricis Brīvzemnieks' memorial stone**  
Opposite the execution place of the national revolutionary J. Zinbergs, there was a pub building – the birth place in 1846 of folklorist Fricis Brīvzemnieks (Treilands). His father was a saddler who rented the Rokaži pub temporarily from the Baron. The memorial stone to the poet and folklorist Fricis Brīvzemnieks (1846–1907) was unveiled in 1982.

## ROKASBIRZE



**1 Monument to the Revolutionaries of 1905**  
Almost 100 fighters perished here in 1905. They had been surrounded on three sides when the baron and Russian army fired at them. The events of 16 December 1905 in Aizpute are commemorated with the stone monument in Rokasbirze, and it has the flag of Latvia and the names of the victims engraved on it. Nearby is another monument of a height of several meters.

## ĶĪRAVA



**1 Introduction to the life of bees**  
Training beehive site of beekeeper Baiba Tikuma welcomes its visitors in summer to explore the life of bee colonies and to try beekeeping, to participate in the breeding of queen bees and to taste the products of these hardworking little insects. Book your visit in advance.

**2 Cirava antiquities storehouse**  
The museum building was built in the 1920s as the headquarters of a credit union (bank). An exposition of the storehouse has many reference materials and photographs, church books, magazines, albums, a variety of household objects (kneading boards, butter making tools, irons), shoemaker and hatter tools, harnesses, gramophones, and other very interesting items.

**3 Cirava Lutheran Church**  
The church was built in Sudmalkains in 1780–1781 upon an order of Baron H. F. von Behr and his wife J. E. von Behr. The church has preserved an old church bell and an organ from the 18th century. National art monuments are made in rococo style: the altar made in 1781, the pulpit and the bench for Barons, with decorated interior. A portrait of Baroness J. E. von Behr in white marble is displayed in the church. Admission for a donation. Book your visit in advance.

**4 Cirava Castle**  
Cirava castle manor was built in 1752 for the von Manteuffels family as a hunting house. It was rebuilt in a neo-gothic style during the 1960s. The manor has partially preserved interior decoration from the 19th century, including eclectic ceiling paintings and stucco ornamentations. The manor viewed from the outside.

**5 Cirava forest park**  
For those who enjoy strolls and beautiful scenery – a hiking trail with benches and bridges has been created in Cirava forest park. Most of the trail leads along the banks of the river Durbe and has views of the many curves of the river and obstructions made by beavers. There are hornbeam, birch, aspen and pine groves along the trail.

**6 "Cita Abra" in Cirava Watermill**  
The Watermill of Cirava Manor is an architectural monument under the state's protection. In 2002, the Watermill was included among the 100 greatest industrial heritage monuments in Latvia and represented the Latvian cultural heritage at the events organised for the European Heritage Days. Cirava Watermill was built in 1881. Currently, it hosts the centre for non-formal education centre and artists' residence and culture called "Cita Abra". The centre is open for visitors in summer.

**7 Dzērve Manor and park**  
Dzērve Manor house was built in the early 19th century. It was destroyed by fire during the revolution in 1905, but later (1906–1912) was rebuilt according to a design by architect G. Berchi in a neo-classicist style. Large white tile fireplace, stairs with handrails and the 20th century interior decorations are still well-preserved from the old period of the ruling barons. The Manor also includes a large landscape park of 6.7 ha created according to the English style of Courland. The Manor currently houses Dzērve primary school.

**8 Recreation area at lake Džekainis**  
The recreation area is fully equipped for swimming (changing rooms, WC, tables and benches), there is a children's playground, camping places for tents, and visitors can rent one of the two boats, as well as enjoy fishing (fees apply to fishing).

## APRIĶI



**1 Apriķi Manor – Museum**  
The baroque-style development of the Manor first appeared at the river Alokste in the early 18th century when a manor house, a granary and a housekeeper's house were built around the yard. The manor house was completed by 1742, and a three-story octagonal neo-gothic tower was added to it in the 19th century. Most of the other buildings – a cattle shed, a brewery, and a mill – were built in the late 19th century, and a small landscape park was created in the same period. Apriķi Manor had been the property of the von Osten-Sackens' family since the 16th century, but later was owned by the von Corfu family from 1790 to 1852. The building now houses Apriķi primary school and the Apriķi Museum, which includes exhibits evidencing the history of the region. A large family of dwarves have found their home in the Museum, too!

**2 Apriķi Lutheran Church**  
The church was built in the mid-17th century and it is one of the most splendid examples of religious art in Latvia. The interior (made in rococo with baroque influences) forms a unified group of woodcarving work.

**3 Laža-Padure Manor**  
Renovation works of the manor house were carried out in the 1970s when a park and an artificial pond were also made. The park has several rare tree species. After the agrarian reform of the first independence of Latvia, the land plot of the Manor was distributed in 1920 to farmers who were fighting for the freedom of Latvia but the castle remained without its owner. In 1929, it was reassigned as a school. In 1969, a special boarding school was opened here.

**4 Neredzīgais Indriķis ("Blind Indriķis") memorial**  
A couple of kilometres away from Apriņi, towards Aizpute, there is the Ģibortu cemetery where the Latvian peasant-poet and song-writer Neredzīgais Indriķis ("Blind Indriķis", 1783–1828) is buried. Although Indriķis was illiterate and lost his eyesight at the early age of 5, he was inspired by church songs of G.F.Stender. He was the first Latvian whose collection of poems was published for the public (in 1806).

## KALVENE



**1 Riga Zoo branch "Cirulji"**  
The zoo's spacious enclosures hosts 38 species of wild animals: kiangs, bears, lynxes, wolves, wild boar, elks, squirrels, birds of prey, as well as a wide range of domestic animals like the Latvian Blue, Highland and Galloway cows, Romanov sheep, Vietnamese pigs; ducks, geese, turkeys, and others. Very attentive visitors will possibly see the rare European tree frogs in the ponds of the park. "Cirulji" in Kalvene parish is a great, wonderfully relaxed place of recreation in a country environment while learning about wildlife.

**2 Tāši-Padure Manor**  
The Corfu family castle, which was built in the early 19th century, was acquired into the property of the Keyserlingks family in 1852. The hunting house of Count Keyserlingk is a splendid example of late classicism and was used as his summer house. The interior preserves several fragments of the old interior's finishing. After the completion of the Manor house, a park of more than 10 ha was built around it with a number of species of foreign trees. Currently the Manor house hosts Kalvene primary school.

**3 Horse riding**  
This small cosy and peaceful farm is located in the countryside. It gives a perfect opportunity of peaceful and relaxing interaction and work with horses in a natural environment. The farm offers horse-riding with their two horses and organises horse cart races. Boarding for horses is offered in summer. Book your visit in advance.
